

8TH ASEM CONFERENCE ON COUNTER-TERRORISM

Brussels 10-11th June 2010

1. Background

At the seventh ASEM Conference on Counter-Terrorism in Manila in June 2009, the Chair's Summary on the Conference stated that the 8th ASEM Conference on Counter-Terrorism will be held in Europe in 2010 and that results of the Conference will be presented to the next ASEM Summit, in Brussels, Belgium in 2010.

Europe and Asia share a common endeavour to combat international terrorism. The United Nations Global Counter -Terrorism Strategy adopted in 2006 is an action plan that guides the international community and the ASEM partners to take the necessary steps to enhance cooperation and to prevent and combat terrorism.

The EU Member States and European Institutions have continued their joint efforts to further improve mechanisms, means and coordination to combat terrorism in the European Union, to protect citizens and safeguard the society and the values by implementing the European Union Counter-Terrorism Strategy in its four main pillars: prevent, protect, pursue and respond, and they have increased international cooperation on these issues.

ASEM partners have committed themselves to prevent and combat terrorism, and some have had extensive experience in dealing with the common threat. Other partners have suffered from continued attacks.



2. Objectives

The general objective of the conference is to continue the dialogue between ASEM partners on measures to address the conditions conducive to the spread of terrorism, measures to prevent and combat terrorism, measures to build States' capacity, and measures to ensure respect for human rights and the rule of law.

Specific objectives of this Conference are:

- To share experiences in the areas of counter terrorism in the light of recent terrorist incidents;
- > To discuss the future of international cooperation, including in the fields of
 - o exchange of information and intelligence,
 - o current work on protection of the population,
 - o current work on aviation security, and
 - o security-related research;
- ➤ To define areas where further capacity building projects could be necessary and should be encouraged.



3. The 8th ASEM Conference on Counter-Terrorism

The 8^{th} ASEM Conference on Counter-Terrorism will be held in facilities of the Federal Public Service of Foreign Affairs in Brussels, Belgium, on the 10^{th} and 11^{th} of June 2010.
